INSTRUCTIONS FOR TEMPORARY CAMPING PERMIT

Extended camping (more than 10 consecutive days) on an undeveloped, residential lot in the Town of Bristol requires a Temporary Camping Permit.

The following information must be provided, along with a completed application and a \$25 fee for the Permit:

- Number and type of camping units on the parcel
- Approved driveway access to the parcel (no on street parking is allowed)
- License plate number(s) of any motorized vehicles and/or trailers on the parcel
- Type of waste processing system, **approved by the Town Health Officer**, that is available for use
- Copy of a fire permit from the Town Fire Dept. if you will have an open fire pit
- A sketch of the parcel showing the lot lines and placement of your camping unit(s) and the operational waste processing system with approximate distances from your boundary lines.

Temporary camping units shall not be located within the setbacks unless, due to lot size, topography, or configuration it is impossible to avoid the setbacks. In this case, the Land Use Office may permit a temporary camping unit be in the setback.

- A letter from the owner of the parcel, if different from the applicant, allowing for temporary camping on the parcel.

Please Note: *The Land Use Office will issue a permit for no more than two temporary camping units, only one of which shall be a recreational vehicle. Failure to abide by this condition may result in the revocation of the permit.*

A temporary camping unit is defined as:

Tents, tent trailers, pop-up trailers, camping vans, pick-up campers, vehicle or any other device or vehicular-type structure as may be developed marketed and used by the camping trade for use as temporary living quarters or shelter during periods of recreation, vacation, or leisure time, that do not include an operational approved waste processing system.
